Incident Management Training for Active Shooter, Violent Events and Reunification

The Illinois Fire Service Institute (IFSI) is proud to offer two Incident Management Courses for leadership personnel in fire, EMS, law enforcement and school administration.

- Active Shooter Incident Management (ASIM) – Basic.
- School Safety and Violent Event Incident Management (SSAVEIM) – Reunification.

Program Overview

These programs are focused on **Incident Management**.

- The ASIM and SSAVEIM Courses are focused on the **Incident Management** for Active Shooter and Violent Events, **not tactics**. While the Instructional Team is made up of law enforcement, fire, emergency medical, emergency management and school administrators, the instruction is focused on how to manage all the command, coordination, communication and resource management challenges of these incidents.

Instructors:

- Police, Fire EMS, Emergency Management and School Administrators.

Cost:

- Grant Funded training. Available at no cost to Illinois police, fire EMS, EMA and schools personnel and agencies.

Training Type:

- Delivered in the field.
- 6 - 8 hours with highly engaging tabletop exercises.



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Active Shooter Incident Management (ASIM) - Basic

This is an introductory 8-hour performance level direct delivery course designed to improve incident management and the integration of law enforcement, fire and EMS responders for active shooter events. The course provides a model framework for use by law enforcement, fire and EMS to manage active shooter event response to improve time to threat neutralization, medical intervention, and survivability of casualties.

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School Safety and Violent Event Incident Management (SSAVEIM)

Reunification

This is an 8-hour performance level direct delivery course designed to improve incident management and response integration of school personnel and emergency responders (law enforcement, fire, EMS) to violent events in schools. The course provides a model framework for use by school personnel, law enforcement, fire, and EMS to manage violent event response to improve time to threat neutralization, medical intervention, survivability of victims, and reunification of students with parents/guardians.

- National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- Active Shooter Incident Management Checklist
- Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC)
- Standard Reunification Method (SRM)

SSAVEIM Tabletop Exercises

Progressively challenging tabletop exercises are utilized to engage all students in the learning process.

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Tabletop Exercises

Both ASIM and SSAVEIM Courses utilize highly interactive tabletop exercises (shown below) to engage and immerse all students in the learning process. Site maps, poker chips that represent people, roles, positions and vehicles, are randomized by dice rolls to add realism to the learning process.

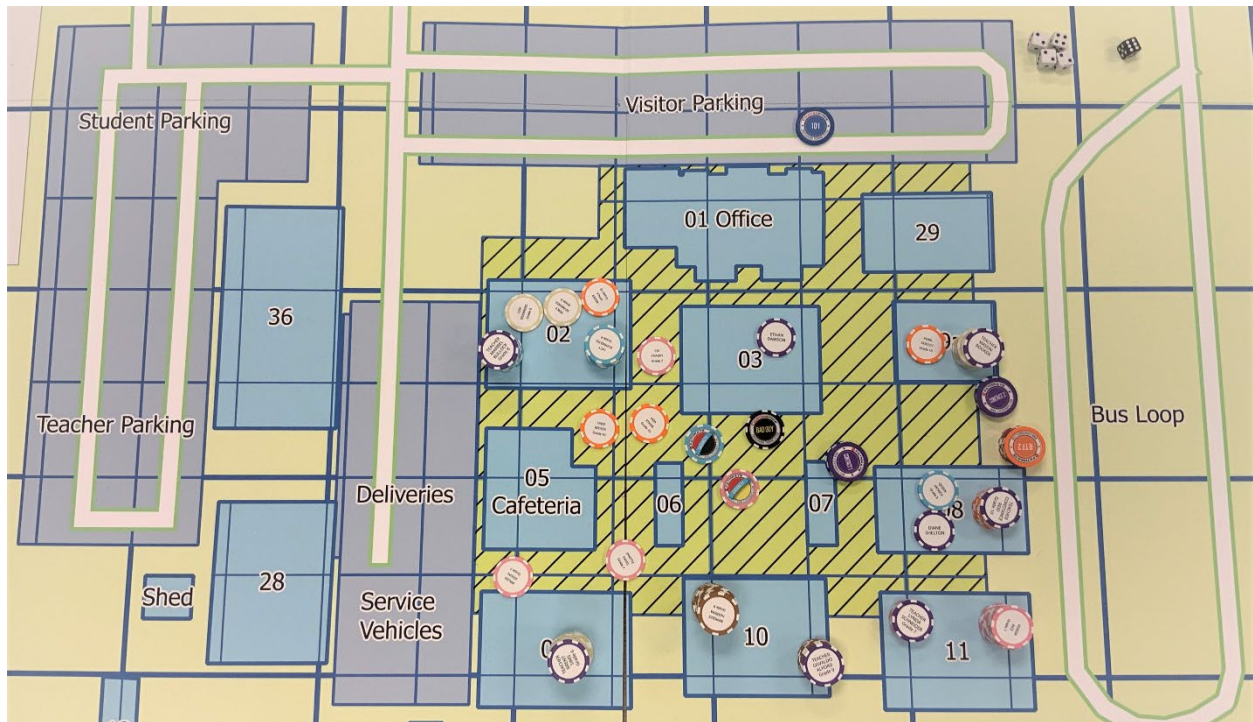
